COASCNA Insurance Report for February 2020 ASC Meeting

Since the COASCNA motion to have a copy of the Regional insurance policy sent to our Area Chairperson failed, I was directed by ASC at the January ASC meeting to arrange with Kirby M, Ohio Region Vice-Chair, to view a copy of the current ORSCNA insurance policy. I was also directed to have Brandon D. and April come along so we could get several viewpoints instead of just mine. Kirby's only available day is Sunday (he works in the evenings the other 6 days) so we tentatively set up a meeting on 2/23. On 2/5 I called Kirby to confirm our meeting and ask him some questions. On 2/9 I also spoke with Sam G., the current Regional Treasurer. During those lengthy and detailed discussions, they both shared more of the background of the insurance situation since 2013 when I stopped participating in Regional service. To get the current policy that the Region has, Kirby and Sam went through a very thorough search using an insurance broker (who happens to be in another fellowship) so the underwriter is fully aware of how NA is structured. The result is a policy that indeed does cover all of the meetings and events in the Ohio Region. Both Sam and Kirby said that there will never be clear wording in the policy that says for example – “500 meetings per week and 25 events per month”. Insurance language is not written as we would expect it to – and if we got our own policy, there would not be wording that we would expect. I understand there may be some discussion about having COASCNA go through a similar process with a professional insurance broker. I would argue that we would end up in the same place with a policy that covers very similarly with what the region covers and that we would end up duplicating services and end up costing this area a lot of money that could be better spent elsewhere. We have elected these Regional trusted servants, asked them to complete the task of getting insurance, and they have very thoroughly

completed that task. I think it's time we accept the statements from the Region that our meetings and our events are covered by insurance.

#### **COASCNA Chairperson's Report for February 2020 ASC Meeting**

- Most of the work that I did in the last month has already been reported in Agenda Business under the motion about the Regional insurance and the Convention audit. I

will continue working on those 2 things during the next month as well as any other work that may come up during the ASC meeting.

- I would like to read one of the parliamentary motions from the Rules of Order in the Guide to Local Service (pages 104-111). It is the “motion to call the Previous Question”.

**Motion to call the PREVIOUS QUESTION.**

**TWO-THIRDS majority required.**

**Is NOT DEBATABLE.**

For our purposes, this may be the most important parliamentary motion. Use it often. This motion is made by a member saying, “*I call for the question,*” or “*I move the previous question.*” It is another way of saying, “I move that debate stop right now and that we vote immediately.” This is one of many motions that can be used to prevent needless, lengthy debate once an issue is clearly understood. This motion is in order after any speaker is finished. You need not be called on. The chair must recognize you when you make this motion, and a vote must be taken with no debate. If two-thirds of the body feels that no more debate is necessary, then it is time to vote and move on. One-point worth making about this motion is that you must be careful not to squelch debate before an issue has been thoroughly aired. Be sure to vote “no” to this motion if you are still confused about the issue at hand or are unsure of how to vote. By allowing debate to continue, we avoid half-baked decisions about half understood questions. On the other hand, the liberal use of this motion makes it unnecessary for the chair to be heavy-handed in stopping discussion, because the chair knows you will stop it soon enough.

- As always, if any trusted servant or any group has any questions related to service or related to the business of the area, I am more than willing to try and answer them for you.

RCM Report to COASCNA

January 19, 2020

Hi Family,

- Jan. 11-12, 2020 I attended the Regional Service Committee meeting in Zanesville, which was hosted by the Mid-East Ohio Area. They also hosted an event that evening with an 80's theme, a Chili Cook-off and speaker.
- My expenses to attend the regional meeting: \$55.17 (1/2 hotel room for 1 night) + \$34.00 (gas) = \$89.17. I am returning \$110.83 of the \$200.00 given up front.
- We received another reminder for areas hosting fundraiser events for the Ohio NA Convention to please contact the OCNA Chairperson, Rodney C. so that he can assure support from the committee at your function (merchandise, etc.)
- We tested our 1st Zoom channel online and had a good time testing so we are moving forward with planning to offer Zoom meetings online as a way for areas to be more involved in the regional work.
- Outcome of COASCNA Motions: Both motions submitted on behalf of the Central Ohio Area were defeated (almost unanimously - except for our vote). The motion directing



more money to be donated to NAWs to prevent the region from holding onto too much money (I'm paraphrasing) was defeated due to the fact that although the ending balance at the end of the previous quarter's meeting was higher than what the region typically carries, there were additional expenses anticipated over the next few months (i.e., RD/RDA travel expenses for CAR/CAT and WSC meetings, insurance policy renewal payment, etc.). Also, there is already a process in place (see ORSCNA Policy) outlining how the region handles larger than usual balances and additional donations to the Midwest Zonal Forum and NAWs. The motion requesting that the COASCNA Administrative body receive a copy of the entire insurance policy was defeated due to the region deciding to limit who has access to the full insurance policy to avoid serious ramifications that have happened previously with individual members filing false claims against NA, ignoring the NA service structure and contacting companies we do business with directly and misrepresenting themselves, and a general concern about the information being misused. Note: this issue has been hotly debated and discussed at the region in the last 2 years (in the aftermath of some of the above issues), and this is where the region made the decision to provide only limited information to members outside of the RSC. Anyone is welcome to contact the Vice-chair (Kirby H.) for more information.

- PR (Chad K.): Purchased 300 pens with the NA logo and regional phonenumber. These pens are available for any area requesting them to use at any PR related events they are participating in. He is also in process of creating purchasing 1 to 2 (depending on cost) stand-up banners with NA information (to replace the tri-fold display boards that we've been using for years). These banners will be easier to transport and display and look much more professional looking as we participate in health and information fairs with our NA exhibit table.
- H&I (Rodney CD): Reaching out to areas to provide any assistance requested, and to assist him in compiling an accurate list of each areas current H& I commitments.
- Outreach (Mattie S.): Visiting various areas and we have encouraged him to develop a tracking log of visits and outcomes. The committee has also proposed (in consultation with PR and H&I) to create a pilot project to connect with addicts who are incarcerated and interested in doing step work with volunteers on the outside. They have written guidelines for this project, however they were originally developed for use in the Central Ohio Area, so they are now being revised to better fit the parameters of the Ohio Region. Writing Steps for Recovery will be connecting with a facility in the Greater Cincinnati Area and they will report back how it's going.
- We discussed the Conference Agenda Report (CAT) that will be voted on during the World Service Conference (WSC) on April 26-May2, 2020 in California. In preparation for that meeting where regional, zonal and world sponsored motions are voted on, our Regional Delegate (Charles F.) shared information to prepare us (the region) to vote on the 11 motions up for consideration. We are bringing these motions back to our area

GSRs to vote on at our March area meeting, we will tally the votes at the April regional meeting, and that vote will be taken to the WSC.

- We have been encouraged to reach out to the RD/RDA if we would like to schedule a CAR/CAT (Conference Agenda Track) workshop in preparation for our area to vote on the 11 motions that are a part of the CAR. As your RCM I am willing to schedule a CAR/CAT workshop (conducted in-person or via Zoom by the RD and/or RDA) if the area votes to do so. They need at least 1 weeks' notice to set up the workshop. We will need to make this decision (date/time/location) at our February ASC meeting. A copy of the motions that need to be voted on was distributed at ASC (and are included with this report). Anyone interested in reading more about the motions can find the CAR at [NA.org/conference](http://NA.org/conference), under the WSC 2020 Conference Agenda Report heading (select English). Pages 37 – 47 described each of the motions in detail and will give you a great foundation for the motions themselves.
- If you are interested in hearing more about the CAR/CAT, there will be a Zoom meeting available for the upcoming MZF CAR/CAT meeting in Grand Rapids, taking place on Jan. 24-26, 2020. Both our Region Delegate and the Regional Delegate Alternate will attend that meeting. Hi family,

So far, we have sold 36 basic and 54 full registrations. As of today, our bank balance is \$5958.81. Our next committee meeting is being held on Sunday March 8<sup>th</sup> from 2-5pm at the Driving Park Library meeting room 3. Open positions are: Registration, Arts & Graphics, and Hotels & Hospitality.

The group has decided on a hotel and are in the works of getting a contract finalized and signed. We will be having the convention at the Marriott by the Airport on January 14<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup>, and 16<sup>th</sup>, 2022. The space is all on one floor and the hotel is giving us all the meeting rooms to use for the convention that weekend. There is a Starbucks inside the hotel and free shuttle to both the Airport and Easton. We were also able to negotiate multiple dinner options this year instead of just one and have a food and beverage minimum of \$5000. The room nights will be \$92/night and there is free parking. We have a 190-night room block with a 70% attrition rate, so we need to fill at least 133 rooms.

**Unplanned Business:**

1. **Motion 2020-02: To suspend section 3.1.IV of policy, “20% of all monies received at ASC or \$50.00 whichever is greater, is to be forwarded to the region.”**

We propose this section be suspended until the regional committee becomes transparent with the insurance policy. In the regional minutes from October, Kirby stated that a declaration page would be available to any RCM that made a request. In January’s Ass meeting we were informed that if we wanted to see the actual policy that our chairperson would have to drive to Tiffin to read the policy but could not have a copy. There is no logical reason that each area should not have a copy of the insurance policy on hand if requested.

**Intent:**

Our second tradition states that “for our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority, a loving god as he may express himself in our group conscious. Our leaders are but trusted servants they do not govern.” Our area’s and our group’s conscious are clear that we want detailed information regarding the insurance policy that is purchased by the

region on our behalf. This motion is to encourage RSC to become transparent to the areas that they serve. Area funds are what provides these services and we want to ensure that area, groups, and activities are covered under such policy.
