From our NA members behind the walls

Ben R shares from the inside about his recovery, virtual meetings, and doing service work.

My name's Ben and I'm an incarcerated addict. It's been great seeing the hard work that the Fellowship has put into hosting online meetings. For us to be able to get outside perspectives has been amazing. It has increased meeting attendance here, and started making people want to learn more about the Fellowship.

Through the online meetings we're able to get that outside perspective. People from NA teach us a little bit more about what the NA way of life looks like and how they do stuff on the outside. It gives us guys here on the inside more to talk about, like where our recovery is and like where we want to get to and stuff.

And it's been great too because I get to do more service work. I got to tell my story in Montenegro to the Adriatic Region Convention. And for my first time being able to really share with individuals, and them being able to hear my story, and to see their reactions to know that we all just alike, you know, in so many ways.

We all still struggle with the same disease of addiction. And we are helping each other because one addict helping another is without parallel. I'm so blessed to be a part of this and to be able to just help individuals learn a little bit more about what we're doing here [behind the walls] and trying to achieve here on the inside.

And then just being able to be a part of the regular virtual meetings themselves is without a doubt, one of the most beautiful things I've ever been a part of.

You know, I can't wait to be able to go home and put this into practice and to be able to see what it looks like. Because today, I know what I want to do when I go home. I know what kind of individual I want to strive to be. And I see it through the works of people in the Fellowship and in the online meetings. They don't judge me for no reason because I'm sitting in prison, they just want to know what they can do to help me in my situation.
